MACKAY WHITSUNDAY JUNIOR REPRESENTATIVE COACH EXPECTATIONS

Pre Carnival:

- Assist in delivery of Development Program
- Run Age Group Trials with assistance from MW & QC.
- Liaise with selection committee to select side.
- Run minimum **6** skill training sessions before NQCA Carnival.
- Run minimum 2 practice matches before NQCA Carnival (QC to organise).
- Communicate to players (individually) their role within team.
- Set Individual and Team Goals for the carnival (Process Led Goals).

*MW & QC will run the following in the lead up to carnivals:

1. S&C/Fielding Sessions on top of team sessions.

During Carnival:

- Lead pre-game stretching and warm up activities.
- Run pre-game team meeting.
 - Focusing on Team Goals, Opposition, Conditions
- Run post-game stretching and warm down activities.
- Run post-game team meeting to review/reflect on game.
 - o Focusing on Team Goals, Performances, Opposition

Post Carnival:

- Give each player individual feedback utilising MW documents.
- Complete MW Representative Season review

Player Development:

- Mackay Whitsunday wants to create holistic players who can problem solve and perform under fatigue and pressure.
 - Coaches are expected to develop players across the following areas:

Skills (Batting, Bowling & Fielding)

Mind (Concentration, Mental Toughness, Positive Mindset)

■ Tactics (Player Roles, Game Situations)

Body (Endurance, Speed, Power & Strength)

MW & QC will support coaches to be upskilled across the above areas (Skills, Mind, Tactics & Body)



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MACKAY WHITSUNDAY JUNIOR REPRESENTATIVE COACH CODE OF BEHAVIOUR

- » Remember that young people participate for pleasure and winning are only part of the fun.
- » Never ridicule or yell at a young player for making a mistake or not coming first.
- » Be reasonable in your demands on players' time, energy, and enthusiasm.
- » Operate within the rules and spirit of your sport and teach your players to do the same.
- » Ensure that the time players spend with you is a positive experience. All young people are deserving of equal attention and opportunities.
- » Avoid overplaying the talented players; the just average need and deserve equal time.
- » Ensure that equipment and facilities meet safety standards and are appropriate to the age and ability of all players.
- » Display control, respect and professionalism to all involved with the sport. This includes opponents, coaches, officials, administrators, the media, parents and spectators. Encourage your players to do the same.
- » Show concern and caution toward sick and injured players. Follow the advice of a physician when determining whether an injured player is ready to recommence training or competition.
- » Obtain appropriate qualifications and keep up to date with the latest coaching practices and the principles of growth and development of young people.
- » Any physical contact with a young person should be appropriate to the situation and necessary for the player's skill development.
- » Respect the rights, dignity and worth of every young person regardless of their gender, ability, cultural background, or religion.
